Ann Arbor Public Schools Summer 2010

The Ann Arbor Public Schools offers a variety of summer programs. Many of the programs are designed for students who would benefit from added educational support during the summer months.

Programs are also available for credit recovery, online and enrichment opportunities.

AAPS offers summer music classes as well as adult education programs.

The district's Rec & Ed program offers an extensive menu of summer camps and tuition based classes.



Elementary Summer Learning Institute SLI

Elementary summer school is by recommendation only from the student's school. The Summer Learning Institute, held at Ann Arbor Open runs July 6 - July 30, between 8:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Monday - Friday. The goal of the Summer Learning Institute is to help the student be more successful when school resumes in the fall. Best teaching practices and low class size are hallmarks of the Summer Learning Institute. Eligibility is based on academic outcomes and teacher recommendations.

Extended School Year ESY

ESY - Extended School Year, is a program for students in special education services. Need is determined by the IEP and Student Intervention and Support Services administration in conjunction with the schools.

Middle School Summer School

The summer program for middle school students who have been recommended by their counselor is scheduled at Skyline High School, June 28 - July 29. Reading skills using Read 180 and math skills, using the E2020 program are used to prepare and support students for the fall.

Summer Learning for English Language Learners (ELL) Attending Northside, Logan, Thurston Elementary Schools

This is a collaboration with Leslie Science Center for beginning level English Language Learners in grades K-5 for these northeast elementary schools. Students are recommended by their school. June 21 - 28

Title I Summer School at Northside

Northside students graduating from 1st, 3rd and 4th grades who haven't met their end of year benchmark targets will be eligible to attend this program. June 21 - July 1

Scarlett Cluster Elementary Summer School Program

(Allen, Carpenter, Pittsfield, Mitchell Schools)

Title I eligible students and ELL students from these elementary schools will be supported with Read 180 as well as targeted math and language arts curriculum. July 6 - 30.

Summer School at Thurston

Thurston students graduating from 3rd and 4th grades will participate in an intense 4-week program using READ 180 and System 44. July 7 - 30

Summer School at Burns Park

Burns Park students graduating from 3rd, 4th, and 5th who are receiving special ed services or ESL support are eligible. August 2 - 9.

Title I Summer School at Haisley

Haisley students graduating from 1st, 3rd and 4th grades and title I eligible will participate in this program. July 6 - 30.

Title I Summer School at Scarlett

Academic intervention for Title I and Title III students to provide additional support for a successful transition to the next grade. June 28 - July 23

High School Programs

Credit & Grade Recovery at Skyline

Two sessions a day for students who need credit or grade recovery using both online and traditional classroom instruction. June 28 - July 29

Enrichment, Advancement in Math or Student Choice
